Legislative Report

The 2020 State Legislative Session began on February 5th and ended on May 6th.

Because of the ongoing Coronavirus Pandemic, the Capital Complex closed on March 13 and remained closed until a the legislative leadership convened a brief session on May 6 with most members absent to formally close the regular session.

Prior to the closure, there had been no legislation introduced in the 2020 Legislative Session that adversely impacted the antique auto hobby.

On Thursday July 23rd, the House held a one day special session to address insulin pricing, tele-medicine, mail-in ballots and police accountability. At the time I am writing this (July 25) the Senate is planning a one day special session on Tuesday July 28 to address these same issues. The Governor will then act on any legislation passed by both the House and Senate.

We are not aware of anything being discussed that would impact the antique auto hobby. So that is a good thing!

4C's Car Show History

A while back, Scott Macgregor was moving and gave me a box of 4C's related paper he kept. Since I had a bit of time and I needed to find something to put in this newsletter, I looked through the box and found information on the 4C's Car Shows through the years (1980 through 2017).

After the October 3, 1979 Windsor Locks Tornado that heavily damaged the Bradley (now New England) Air Museum, the 4C's held a benefit show on June 1, 1980 for the museum. Due to construction, the 1981 show was cancelled, but a second benefit show was held on July 25, 1982 in Windsor Locks.

From 1983 through 1986, the 4C's co-sponsored a car show with the Connecticut Secretary of the State's office at the Griswold Airport in Madison to benefit the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation on the first Sunday in June.

In 1987 through 2017 on the first Sunday in June, the 4C's returned to the New England Air Museum for annual car shows benefiting the Museum.

On pages 4 through 8 of this Newsletter, I have included show flyers and info from the various shows. I hope you enjoy some of this history since so many car shows this year are being cancelled because of the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic.

Car Show Benefits Air Museum

Over 500 antique and classic cars from some 30 local auto clubs of the Connecticut Council of Car Clubs and surrounding states are entered in an Antique, Classic Car Show and Flea Market at the Bradley Air Museum in Windsor Locks on Sunday, June 1, 1980 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., to benefit the tornado-torn air museum.

Ken Lewis of Hamden, chairman of the all-day benefit show and flea market, is shown above, on the left, with his 1928 Whippet. Philip C. O'Keefe of Windsor Locks, the Museum Director, is shown on the right with his vintage P2V-5 Navy Neptune in the background. They are expecting the "biggest turn-out ever" of antique car buffs.

Featured will be vintage autos and aircraft, 100 flea market booths, on-going entertainment with clowns and special events to include a Model-T Cranking Contest and a spark plug Removal/Installation Contest. Special antique cars to be shown are the 1903 Oldsmobile, Waverley Electric and Stanley Steamers. In case of inclement weather, the rain-date is set for June 8.

Mr. Jack Cable of Torrington, chairman of the car club's council known as the 4 C's, said, "The local clubs have joined together to help the museum in its efforts to preserve aviation heritage similar to our own club's goals to preserve automobile heritage. Bradley Air Museum was brutally battered by a tornado last fall, which destroyed 23 aircraft on display and all public facilities ... and we would like to help them get started again with this benefit."

General admission to all car show, aircraft and flea market exhibits will be \$2 for adults; \$1 for children six through eleven; and all children five years of age and under will be admitted free of charge when accompanied by an adult. 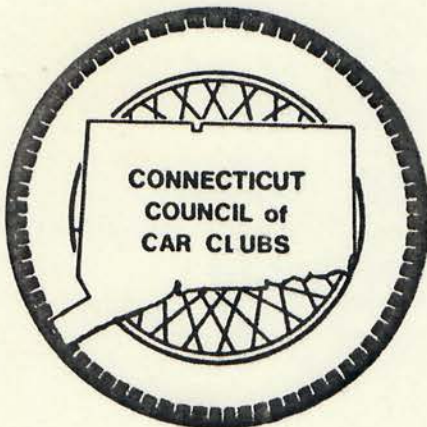

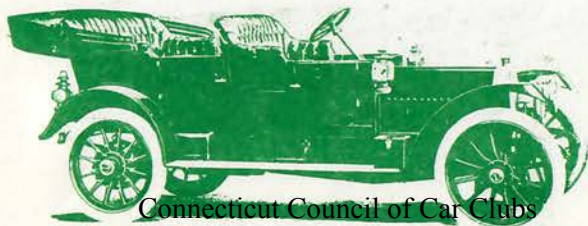

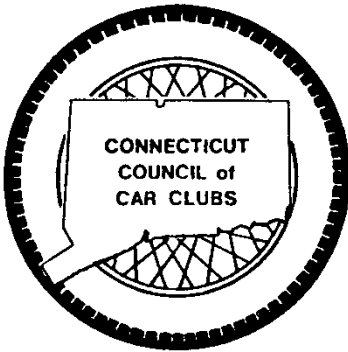
