Legislative Report

The 2020 State Legislative Session began on February 5th and is scheduled to end on May 6th.

Because of the ongoing Coronavirus Pandemic, the Capital Complex closed on March 13 and the Legislature will not meet prior to the scheduled May 6 completion date of the regular session.

Prior to the closure, there had been no legislation introduced in the 2020 Legislative Session that will adversely impact the antique auto hobby. So that is a good thing!

The table included on Page 3 of this newsletter summarizes the bills related to the hobby and other transportation related matters of interest that have been introduced in the legislative session prior to its shutdown.

The path forward is not entirely clear. Hughes and Cronin provided us with an update of what they anticipate will take place. The Democratic leadership has indicated to the various Committee Chairpersons that it will consider one bill that includes its "priorities." That one bill will likely contain a variety of unrelated topics in it. The expectation is that the Legislature will be called into a no more than one day Special Session in the early to late June time period.

It is vital for the protection of all antique car hobbyists that Bill No. 5673 pertaining to the taxation of Antique Automobiles get out of Committee and be presented to the House Floor.

This Bill was introduced by Representative Miller of the 55th. District and Representative Sayres of the 68th. District and would provide that Motor Vehicles for which number plates have been issued, under Section 14 through 20 under the General Statutes, be assessed for local property tax purposes at a value of not more than \$100.00.

Please contact your State Representative and State Senator at once, either by letter or phone. The General Assembly will adjourn early in June and there is no time for delay.
