Cliff Baker reported that he has paid our annual insurance premium but hasn't got the bill yet for the new D&O insurance policy.

Old Business

Bill Nitschke stated that the student learning exercise at Valley Regional High School is set for May 24, from noon to 1:30. Members interested to participate should contact Bill. He also said he will explore whether students would be interested in satisfying their commitment to do community service by volunteering at our show (to assist with parking, for example).

Peter Christianson said that he and some other BACC officers will meet with the board of the Haddam Neck Fairgrounds Association on March 14 at 5 p.m. to discuss our contract for using the field as well as ways to improve the facility and the show. He noted that the HNFA would like to add additional events during the season.

Peter also said the East Hampton Library was booked on the first Wednesdays of May, June and July when he went to reserve the conference room for our upcoming monthly meetings. For those months he put in a reservation for the second Wednesdays instead. Members indicated their approval.

New Business

Guest Joan Liska of the Middletown Military Museum announced that they will hold a military vehicles show on July 20. COMVEC is invited, however, this is not their show. The location is 200 Walnut Grove Rd. in Veterans Park in Middletown (said to be behind Palmer Field, accessible from Rte. 66).

Alan Carlson confirmed that the East Hampton Masonic Lodge will be the food vendor at our August Meet.

Trophy and dash plaques have been ordered by *Scott Macgregor* from the vendor in the same quantities as last year for both Meets. Price is up \$75 to \$1,475.

Polly Beckwith stated that we have enough trophy bells for this year except for the large #10 size used for the special awards at the August Meet. She ordered six of them at \$37 apiece.

Polly also indicated that Mark Johnson, retired former Klingberg concours manager, shared a list of owners of Connecticut-made cars who had previously registered examples for the Connecticut car display that had traditionally been part of their event. He will send them a post card alerting them that our August Meet will feature Connecticut-made cars. He advised Polly that Klingberg did not intend to continue their concours.

Guest Rich Drambowski of AACA-CCR stood up to announce that, while Klingberg is no longer in a position to put on a show themselves, he is in talks with them and potential sponsors to produce a scaled down event, tentatively called "The Klingberg Reunion" that would continue their pre-war concours tradition. Klingberg would lend their facility to the event but would not sponsor or insure it. Rich is proposing to augment the concours with a car club showcase. Interested clubs would display some of their members' cars and staff an adjacent table to promote the club to the attending public. Members would also be welcome to volunteer assistance in running the event. Rich, who is a senior master AACA judge said he would serve as chief judge of the concours and would recruit other AACA certified judges for the concours. He indicated that Wayne Carini, who previously was Grand Marshal for the Klingberg Motorcar Series, was interested to reprise that role. The event Rich envisions would be smaller than past Klingberg shows, allowing room for spectator parking on-site in the lower lot of the Klingberg campus at 370 Linwood St. (past events had parking at the New Britain baseball field, with shuttle service to Klingberg). The benefit for Klingberg Family Centers is that all profits realized after expenses would be donated to Klingberg's car restoration program. BACC members were receptive to participating in the car club showcase and we await word as to whether Rich can meet his objective to be able to put on an event on the Saturday of Father's Day weekend, its traditional date.

Upcoming Club Activities

Cliff Baker announced that this year's Spring Dust-Off will be held on Sunday, May 5. We will meet at 11:00 a.m. at the parking lot at Gillette Castle in East Haddam, where we will have to time to socialize and walk the grounds before eating lunch (BYOL). Afterwards we will caravan to Moodus Ice Cream for dessert and an impromptu car show, then dispersing for home.

Special HFHA Presentation







HOBBY HEADLINES & HISTORY

Gooding & Co. Auction Makes Some History at Amelia Island

The premier auction house held its 14th annual sale at the recent Amelia Island Concours, grossing over \$67 million on 111 cars sold (out of 127 on offer). A 1903 Mercedes-Simplex 60 HP "Roi des Belges" was the top seller at just over \$12.1 million, making it the most expensive pre-1930's car ever sold at auction. In all, 14 vehicles sold for one million dollars or more. The sale was also notable for the 20 Art-Deco era European cars (mostly French) sold from the former Mullin Museum in Oxnard, Calif., many of which achieved higher than their pre-sale estimate. Leading that group was a 1935 Bugatti Type 35C Grand Prix that sold for \$582,500. Several coach-built Citroens were among the others that changed hands. (Gooding will hold a second auction of the remaining Mullin collection cars in Oxnard on April 26. It will be live-streamed at https://www.goodingco.com.)

CONNECTICUT-Made Industrial Engines

American & British Manufacturing, Co. - Bridgeport: from 2 1/2 to 18 horsepower

Automatic Machine Company - Bridgeport: two-cycle, adapted from a marine application

C.L. Barker Company - Norwalk: two-cycle, with make-and-break ignition

Bridgeport Motor Company - Bridgeport: eight two-cycle and five four-cycle choices offered through the 1920s

Denison Electric Engineering Co. - New Haven: offered in 1900 as a complete engine or assemble-it-yourself casting package

Foster Motor Company - New Haven: 1907 compound compression engine


Frisbie Motor Co. - Middletown/Cromwell: automotive/marine style, also built cars and produced Frisbie pies and then Frisbie toys

Frisbie

Three Cylinder Motor, 18 and 25 H. P.

Frisbie Three Cylinder Motor, 18 and 25 HP from Catalog No. 16, believed to be 1919

Gray & Prior Machine Co. Hartford, Connecticut



Hartford two-cylinder engines were available in 10 and 20 horsepower sizes. A 4 x 4½ inch bore and stroke was used on the 10 horsepower model, with 5 x 5½ being the dimensions on the 20 horsepower size. Hartford regularly equipped their engines with low tension make-and-break ignition, and supplied high tension spark plugs only on order. The company contended that low tension ignition was less susceptible to shorting out due to moisture, an idea with some merit. This 10 horsepower Hartford carried a 1916 price of \$203. Gray & Prior continued in business until about 1930.

Gray & Prior Machine Company - Hartford: 10 and 20 hp. two-cycles, through 1930

Hubbard Motor Co. - Middletown: from 1897 to the 1920s, known for its "Baby" 1 1/2 hp marine engine

International Power Vehicle Co. - Stamford: began in 1902, with 1 1/2 to 20 hp

J.W. Lathrop & Co. - Mystic: marine applications, from 1900-ish through the 1950s

Mianus Motor Works - Mianus: 2 to 12 hp marine engines, starting in 1899

New Departure Mfg. Co. - Bristol: patented by Albert F. Rockwell, of automotive fame, in 1910, with exhaust pressure to control the intake valve

New London Ship & Engine Company - Groton: as the name implies, from 100 to 1,000 hp, built under German M.A.N. designs

Palmer Bros. - Cos Cob: from 1895 through WW II, with over 80,000 made (mostly marine)

Wolverine Motor Works - Bridgeport: two-cylinder, four cycle complete with a small air compressor to operate a marine whistle
