A motion was made and approved to make a \$200 donation to the program. In addition, individual members donated several boxes of automotive tools.

## **HOBBY HEADLINES & HISTORY**

**Ford Motor Company Founded 120 Years Ago** - Henry Ford and eleven stockholders incorporated the company in Michigan on June 16, 1903, beginning the venture with \$28,000 in cash, some tools and early blueprints, and a lot of faith in Henry's vision.

**First New Plymouth Produced 95 Years Ago** - Chrysler Corporation built the first Plymouth on June 7, 1928 and introduced the brand to the public at Madison Square Garden in New York a month later. Plymouth was positioned as a competitor to Chevrolet and Ford in the low-priced field. The brand quickly rose to the number three position in U.S. sales and, by early 1957, ten million Plymouths had been produced. Plymouth built a reputation for muscle cars in the 1960's and minivans in the 1980's. Nevertheless, by the late '90's Plymouth sales were in decline, ultimately leading to its discontinuation by DaimlerChrysler in 2001.

**75th Anniversary of the Tucker to be Celebrated June 16-18, 2023** - The Tucker Automobile Club of America will host an event at the AACA Museum in Hershey, Penn. Tucker family members, marque specialists, and club members and their cars will participate. (47 of the original 51 Tucker cars produced are known to exist today.) The fiberglass bodies of the Corvettes and Avantis are made in sections bonded together with outer seams filled. The other two cars have all-welded, steel body shells. The front fenders on Chrysler Airflows and MGAs are bolt-on units.

- 1863 One Hundred Sixty Years Ago: Henry Ford is born in his parent's farm house in Springwells Township, MI.
- **1903 One Hundred Twenty Years Ago:** Ford Motor Company is founded on June 16th.

## 1913 - One Hundred Ten Years Ago:

The Moving Assembly Line is installed at the Highland Park Plant.

1923 – One Hundred Years Ago: Edsel and Eleanor Ford's daughter Josephine is born July 7th.

## 1933 - Ninety Years Ago:

Production of the Ford Trimotor Airplane ends due to poor depression era sales.

## 1943 - Eighty Years Ago:

Henry and Clara Ford's only son, Edsel Ford, dies on May 26th at the age of 49.

## 1953 - Seventy Years Ago:

The popular Ford 8N tractor is retired to make way for a new "Golden Jubilee" tractor.

## 1963 - Sixty Years Ago:

The legendary Ford small block 289 V8 engine is introduced.
