FUEL FOR THOUGHT



William C. Durant

In 1942, long after his days as a captain of the automotive industry were over, William C. Durant, the man who had once created, and twice helmed, General Motors, wrote a letter to an industry veteran he had long ago singled out for his work ethic and hired, who had gone on to earn his own place in the history of the American automobile. In it Durant recalled, "I remember so well meeting you in the hardware store, at which time I was very much interested in you. ... I suggested that you come over to the factory and you promptly accepted." The young man, twenty six years old, went from being a clerk at the store to stuffing seat cushions at the Flint Road Cart Co. factory in 1890. By 1895 he was running the renamed Durant-Dort Carriage Co. as its vice president and general manager. All the while he - Charles W. Nash - worked to better his education as he strived to ensure the company's success as the country's largest producer of horse-drawn carriages.

When William C. Durant's other company, the one that made automobiles, got into financial trouble in 1910, he suggested that the bankers who came in to run GM put Charles Nash in charge of Buick, the division with the most potential. Nash succeeded by all measures and was rewarded in 1912 with the presidency of GM. In 1915 he left GM after its profits had tripled and Durant was about to reassume control. Nash wanted to run his own automobile company, so he teamed up with a Boston banker and bought the Thomas B. Jeffery Co. of Kenosha, Wisc. the following year. His hands-on approach paid off. The first Nash-named cars bowed in 1918 and from then on Charles Nash never looked back. It wasn't until 1937 that he relinquished the management reins of the company, choosing George W. Mason, then president of Kelvinator Corp. to follow in his footsteps. In order to make this happen, Nash had to engineer one final deal of his storied career, that being the merger of Nash and Kelvinator.

Jay Beveridge reported that the Essex Automobile Club will join us for our Spring Dust-Off Drive to Gillette Castle in Hadlyme. There is no set route, only a meeting time at the castle parking area of 11:00 a.m. or thereabouts. Bring your own box lunch and a chair. Spend as much time at the park as you wish, socializing, talking old cars and walking the park grounds. Although the castle itself is still closed to visitors, toilet facilities are available. Depart when you like and enjoy a leisurely drive home. Fred Fitch suggests stopping by the Zagray show, which is open to 4 p.m. By parking in their antique car display area you can get into the event for free. Antique Engine & Tractor Meet - Prior to our meeting, the State of Conn. could not assure Jon Grant that we would be able to use the field at Salmon River State Forest late in April. Outdoor gatherings on state property were still limited to 200 people. After discussing the chances of this changing and debating the pros and cons of making a late decision to go with the only option available to us (*Tim Cone*'s property), a motion was made and passed such that, if there was no change to the state's position during the week following the meeting, the Meet would be canceled for this year. The <u>June BACC</u> meeting will be combined with a pot-luck picnic at the home of *Richard* and *Polly Beckwith* in Haddam on Saturday, June 5. Details in the next newsletter.

Our guest speaker was Steve Rossi. Steve spoke about the significance of car clubs in people's lives. He drew from his own experiences being involved with car clubs for the past fifty years. In 1972 he joined with a group of Long Island clubs that had banded together to hold autocrosses at the old Air Force Base at Mitchell Field. From there he became a founding member of the Vintage Triumph Register where he met enthusiasts he still interacts with today. Steve credits having been able to get a job at Ford Motor Co. to advice from a Ford contact he met by chance at a VTR convention in Illinois the summer after graduating from engineering school. Over the years Steve says he has found car clubs to offer a 1+1=3 experience, tapping the knowledge that members have and by personally getting involved in running meets and doing publications. The life blood of any club is its magazine or newsletter. They help keep the club together, especially in the case of clubs with a wide geographical spread. He maintains that you don't need a car to join a marque club, adding that doing so before buying one of those cars allows you to learn more about them and the support that is available. He mused about the future of car clubs and whether there are too many big national clubs to be sustainable in the long term. As an example, does the hobby really need two Model A organizations? Steve concluded by saying he is a big proponent of there being even more local clubs, active ones where comradery is key.


HOBBY HEADLINES & HISTORY

Goldenrod Garage In The Hands of Auctioneers - Readers of *Hemmings Motor News* over the last few decades will surely remember the ever-present multi-make ads from the collector car store in Freeport, Maine, whose motto was "Interesting older autos talked about enthusiastically, bought, sold, traded." Last October, Goldenrod Garage founder and proprietor Neil B. Martin passed away peacefully at his home at the age of 77. The business has now been closed. The remaining Goldenrod Garage inventory, automobilia and other collectibles will be liquidated in an on-line auction open from April 25 to May 10, after which the real estate will be sold. Noted French Automobile Designer Robert Opron Passed Away on March 29, 2021 - The avant-garde car designer, 89, in declining health for some time, succumbed to COVID-19. Opron designed the last great generation of

Citroen cars before the company was taken over by Peugeot in the mid-1970's. The SM, GS and CX car lines he penned were aerodynamic and modern, and, while sharing a family resemblance, each was unique in its own right. Subsequently Opron moved to Renault where he was responsible for the design of the Renault Fuego and Alpine V6, among other projects. Monsieur Opron capped his career with a six-year stint at Fiat and then semi-retired in 1992 as an independent design consultant to Ligier and other firms.

[Mercury's version of the mid-90s Ford Contour compact was called "Mystique." "Marvel Mystery Oil" was a widely sold oil additive and upper cylinder lubricant. "Mystere" was the name of a Ford dream car that debuted in 1955.]



DRIVE-THRU EVENT SCHEDULED FOR SATURDAY, JUNE 19, 2021

For 29 years, the Klingberg Vintage Motorcar Events have provided an opportunity to see rare historic antique cars and to give back, as all proceeds go directly to programs that help children and families. On Saturday, June 19, Klingberg will hold a safe alternative—a unique drive-thru event, as was held in September of 2020. Show cars will be placed around Klingberg's 40-acre campus and spectators will drive along a predetermined 20-minute route.

Cars: All antique cars (1989 and older) will arrive early and be guided into display areas throughout the campus, with Pre-war Concours automobiles gathered into one area. All show cars will be arranged with extra space between them for safety and so they can be appreciated by the spectators driving through.

Spectators: Spectators will drive their own cars along a special spectator car travel lane winding through every field and parking lot of show cars, so no car will be missed. Spectators can enjoy the approximately 20-minute drive, an adventure in automotive history, and the beautiful hilltop view. (For everyone's safety, there will be no spectators walking or exiting their cars.)

Sponsorship: Platinum, Gold, and Palladium sponsors will be recognized with signs at the entrance and can register to ride through the Motorcar Event in an antique convertible or open automobile. All sponsors will be listed on a handout to everyone in attendance.

Fees: We are waiving the entrance fees for car owners and spectators to avoid the exchange of credit cards and cash. However, there will be opportunity and encouragement to make a donation. All proceeds will go directly to fund Klingberg programs serving families dealing with trauma, especially families that have been hit hard during this difficult time.
